United support for the full review of the Retirement Villages framework



To Ministers,

The undersigned organisations either work with or represent the majority of the 900,000+ seniors in Aotearoa New Zealand.

We collectively acknowledge the ongoing full review of the Retirement Villages legislation and policy framework. We express our united support for its urgent continuation with a resulting bill consulted on through to the Select Committee.

We acknowledge many residents are 'happy' with village life, but we collectively share concerns about the fairness and gaps in consumer protection afforded to the 50,000+ residents in retirement villages, with an average age of 81 years.

Several of the undersigned submitted before the Select Committee in 2022 on the need for timely repayment of resident capital and other issues demonstrating disproportionate contractual rights, costs and benefits between operators and residents. During 2023 to 2024, the Commerce Commission identified a range of potentially 'unfair terms', terms enabled under a framework we want to see made fairer for consumers and fit for future generations.

Each organisation signing is aware of the concerns held by the people they represent. This includes the 13,000 signatures RVResidents submitted in a petition (during covid) in November 2021, calling for an urgent review, and a call for the prompt return of resident capital after their exit from a village.

We request Government completes the full review of the RV legislative and policy framework, and processes a bill through the Select Committee noting:

- A full review inclusive of Select Committee will be more effective and efficient use of resource than Code variation procedure under the existing framework.
- Code variations alone would address less than 20% of the issues identified. Statutory change is required for most issues.
- A full review is more likely to deliver future-proofed outcomes and ensure fairness for retirees as they consider their retirement housing accommodation choices.
- A full review will likely help ensure a wider range of affordable housing choices exist to reflect the needs and financial circumstances of our changing demographic.
